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Chicago, IL, January 10, 2020 – **ANDREW RAFACZ** is pleased to announce the beginning of 2020 with *Empathy Fatigue*, a group exhibition of works by Dominique Knowles, Jason Lazarus, Mev Luna, Liz Nielsen, Rachel Schmidhofer, Siebren Versteeg, and Jeremy Weber in Galleries One and Two. The exhibition continues through Saturday, February 22, 2020.

Empathy Fatigue examines our contemporary relationship with empathy and its limitations in our current human experience. The exhibition aims to connect seven contemporary artists' varied practices to a shared concern for a deeply impassioned relationship to others and the complex world we live in, as well as the collateral emotional damage that inevitably and continually results from such care.

A relatively recent term used in the study of care-giving, empathy fatigue describes the results of a state of psychological, emotional, mental, physical, spiritual and occupational exhaustion that occurs as a counselor's own wounds are revisited by the patient's regular chronicling of theirs. It is a specific kind of burnout that results in the loss of the ability to nurture.

For this exhibition, empathy fatigue also describes a larger collective concern for the health of all of our being as we navigate an ever-complexifying world. It is clearly urgent that we must press on, to understand each other and our responsibility to the planet and the world we've constructed. Each of the artists in this exhibition, while addressing a variety of specific issues and manifesting them directly or conceptually, solemnly or playfully, earnestly engages in empathy as a core driver to better understanding and care.

DOMINIQUE KNOWLES (Bahamian, b. 1996) lives and works in Chicago, IL. Knowles is currently a Master of Fine Art candidate in Painting at School of the Art Institute of Chicago and received his BFA from School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2017. Recent solo exhibitions include The Green Gallery East (Milwaukee, WI) and The National Art Gallery of The Bahamas (Nassau, Bahamas). Knowles has had group exhibitions at Halle 14 (Leipzig, Germany), Elmhurst Art Museum Elmhurst, Illinois), ANDREW RAFACZ (Chicago, IL), and Julius Caesar (Chicago, IL).

JASON LAZARUS (American, b. 1975) lives and works in Tampa, FL. He received an MFA in photography from Columbia College Chicago in 2003 and a BS from DePaul University in 1998.
